

Foreword by Prof. Vasudha Kamat, Vice Chancellor

SNDT Women's University, a renowned institution of higher learning, was established by the great social reformer Bharat Ratna Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve on July 5, 1916 in Pune. (The centennial year of the university was celebrated in 2015-16 with great enthusiasm and gusto befitting the significance attached to this event. A women's university with a purpose, stepping into its hundredth year is no small matter!)



I am pleased to present this Annual Report of the SNDT Women's University of the Centennial Year period from June 2015 to May 2016. The year-long

celebrations started on July 5, 2015, the Foundation Day of the university. It was a great pleasure to listen to Foundation Day Address by Eminent Scientist and Padma Vibhushan Dr. Raghunath A. Mashelkar, President of Global Research Alliance; Chairman, National Innovation Foundation and Former Director-General CSIR. He also released the University IT Security Policy by uploading it on the website. Dr. Mashelkar inaugurated the 40-days' Digital India Campaign. The Government of India envisaged Digital India Campaign as a weeklong affair. We at SNDTWU extended it to 40 days to reinforce its importance in the minds of students and staff. Dr. Subhash Chandra Goyal, Founder and Chairman, Essel Group felicitated students and faculty members with Awards on Independence Day.

This annual report is full of activities, programmes, student activities, student internship, winning of prizes and awards at state, national, international levels, publications, faculty research as well as participation in varied academic activities.

The 65th Convocation (from the State Recognition and 98th Convocation from establishment of the University in 1916) was organized on Wednesday, February 17, 2016. Shri. Sudhir Mungantiwar, Hon'ble Minister of Finance, GoM delivered the Convocation Address. During this 65th convocation, the degrees and diplomas were awarded to 11843 students which include 47 Ph.D., 2402 Masters, 157 PG Diplomas, 8872 Bachelors and 312 undergraduate diplomas as well as 53 certificates. Hon'ble Minister announced that GoM will give Centennial Year Grant to the university and true to his words, he did it. His Cabinet colleague and Hon'ble Minister of Higher and Technical Education, Mr. Vinod Tawde announced a Centennial Grant of Rs. 75 Crore to SNDTWU on May 11, 2016. Thanks to Government of Maharashtra for their keen interest in Women's Education.

This Centennial Year was Very Special in more ways than one. The SNDT Women's University was awarded **A Grade** by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in February 2016. SNDT College of Arts and Commerce for Women, Pune was awarded **B Grade** with a CGPA of 2.76. SVT College of Home Science, an Autonomous College of the University, was awarded the "**College with Potential for Excellence (CPE)**" Honor, Phase III (2015-2020).

This year was special because of one more reason: Creation of wonderful infrastructure. The JSW Foundation, under the chairmanship of Smt. Sangita Jindal sponsored the Restoration of SNDT Kanyashala Building, Girgaum, a Grade III Heritage building. The building with its full glory and original beauty was inaugurated on October 12, 2015. The building will now house JSW Centre of Art along with Undergraduate and Post graduate Drawing and Painting departments of the University. World renowned Restoration Architect Abha Narain has brilliantly carried out the restoration of this majestic 3 story building.

Renovation of the basement space in the Main Building at Churchgate campus was completed and was inaugurated as Maharshi Karve Seminar Complex at the hands of Shri. Vinod Tawde, Hon'ble Minister, Higher and Technical Education, GoM on May 11, 2016. This is a beautiful Complex facility for academic activities



including Dr. Iravarti Karve Hall and Mahadevi Verma Hall (built with UGC grant to Department of Hindi). Thanks to Specified Undertaking of UTI (SUUTI) for supporting the renovation work.

The new building of Janki Devi Bajaj Institute of Management Studies (JDBIMS) at Maharshi Karve Vidyavihar, Pune, (with about 35000 sq ft, ground plus one floor including a 350-seated Auditorium) was inaugurated by Padma Bhushan Shri. Rahul Bajaj, Chairman, Bajaj Group, Pune on May 12, 2016. This has been possible due to generous donation from the Bajaj Group. Our heartfelt thanks to Shri. Rahul Bajaj, Shri. Shekhar Bajaj and Shri. Niraj Bajaj for their wholehearted support!

The inspiring journey of this great institution was captured in a Film titled "The First 100 Years". It was written and directed by well-known creative film director Smt. Suhasini Mulay and was released at the hands of Shri. Vinod Tawde, Hon'ble Minister, Higher and Technical Education, GoM on May 11, 2016. It is a valuable documentation of an inspiring journey of an institution against all odds.

During this Centennial Year, SNDTWU was given the honor of hosting Ten-day residential camp "Avhan: Chancellor's Brigade" for the NSS volunteers of 22 universities in Maharashtra. It was a valuable experience to organize this "Disaster Management Training Camp" for 1120 NSS volunteers (May 25-June 3, 2015) in Mumbai. Thanks to all my colleagues who worked relentlessly to make this event a great success, academically as well as professionally. Guidance and support from Dr. Atul Salunke, SLO and OSD, NSS Cell GoM is greatly cherished.

Internationalization is an important aspect of progressiveness of a university. SNDTWU has been interested in providing international exposure to its faculty members and students. Faculty participation in conferences, seminars at international platform provides such an opportunity. Many expert academicians from foreign universities, institutions visited departments, conducted colleges and had a very valuable interaction, exchange of ideas.

This year, many student-centric initiatives continued, some more were newly introduced. Internship and Research of 8-credits each are mandatory and students enjoyed both. Internship gave them the real life experience and many students got job offers. First-hand experience of conducting research is a very valuable and provides the students additional value in their further studies. The innovative activities conducted by Subject Associations from postgraduate department are greatly appreciated.

In a rapidly changing technological world, the university is attentive and responsive to the learning needs of students. There was tremendous response from students from all three campuses for the 40-day long Digital India Campaign in July August. In order to address the needs of these 21st Century learners the university developed its Technology Enabled Learning (TEL) Policy in collaboration with Commonwealth of Learning, Canada. Thanks to Prof. Asha Kanwar, President, COL and Dr. Sanjaya Mishra, Education Specialist, COL for their wholehearted support in this initiative. I am happy that the Management Council of SNDTWU has approved the TEL Policy and now it is available on website. As a coordinator of this project Dr. Jayashree Shinde, Head, DET conducted campus wide survey of students during this year. It was revealing that 87% of students on campus had Smart phones and expected the faculty members to use ICTs to a great extent to facilitate their learning process. Hopefully, the university departments start integrating ICTs in the process of teaching-learning-assessment.

Our students have been very actively involved in cultural activities (Yuva Mahotsav, Indradhanushya, Tejaswini), Sports (Ashvamedh), NSS (Avhan), Research (Aavishkar), NCC, as well as IEEE, ACM Chapter activities..



We all are very much aware that education has the power to transform lives at any and every age. Higher Education is particularly important, as the development of a nation in many fields is dependent on professionally trained, culturally strong and emotionally committed citizens. Universities are entrusted with this responsibility to develop such a human-power. I am proud to state that SNDTWU fully engaged in creating such women of substance.

On July 5, 2016, this University will enter into its Second Century, a grand achievement indeed. As a last foreword to an Annual Report by its 11th Vice Chancellor, I wish this great university a Very Bright Future!

Highlights of Centennial Year 2015-16

Bharat Ratna Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve declared his intension to establish the Indian Women's University in his Presidential Address at the 29th Indian National Social Congress on December 30, 1915. It is a pleasure to place before the readers excerpts from this historic speech reprinted in this pre centennial Annual Report.

Mr. Sudhir Mungantiwar, Hon'ble Minister of Finance, Government of Maharashtra, delivered the convocation address during the 65th Convocation held on February 17, 2016. Reiterating the importance of women's education, Hon'ble Minister said, "If a woman is educated she makes the world around her a beautiful place." During this 65th Centennial Year Convocation, the degrees and diplomas were awarded to 11843 students, which include 47 Ph.D., 2402 Masters, 157 PG Diplomas, 8872 Bachelors and 312 undergraduate diplomas as well as 53 certificates.

During the Centennial Year NAAC awarded **A Grade** to the University. This was a great achievement for the student, faculty and staff of the university as

In the year 2013-14, Internship and Research were introduced for all P.G. programmes improving the employment- worthiness of students. In the academic year 2015-16, 1642 students successfully completed their Internship in 674 organizations.

During this year, Subject Associations on three campuses conducted many programmes including Vidyarthini Sahitya Sammelan and Student-led conference/Seminar. About 300 students participated in the Vidyarthini Sahitya Sammelan. More than 800 students and 50 teachers participated in the two Student-led conference (Junhu campus) and One day Seminar (on Churchgate campus).

It was very heartening to see students on three campuses wholeheartedly participating in 40-day long Digital India campaign. This was flagged off by Dr. Mashelkar on University Foundation Day (July 5) and concluded by felicitating students and teachers at the hands of Dr. Subhash Chandra Goel on Independence Day (August 15). Students' enthusiasm in experimenting with technology is very valuable.

During the year 2015-16 the University had 172 affiliated colleges in 7 states. The University offered 187 academic programmes.

The University received a total funding of **Rs. 81,34,510/-** through project grants from GoI as well as GoM and Rs. 489.5 Lakh under RUSA (Rashtriya Uchch Shiksha Abhiyan) Grant. This year Centennial Year Endowment Fund drive was conducted. 109 donors donated Rs. 24 lakh towards the Endowment fund.

Faculty members conducted 55 research studies. Forty seven students defended their work in Open Defence and all were granted the Ph.D. degree. 2402 students conducted research and were awarded Master Degree.

This year being a Centennial Year, many programmes and activities both academic, and cultural, were conducted. The University conducted 48 programmes, Post graduate departments conducted 80 and conducted colleges conducted 31 activities including Conferences, seminars, workshops and others. This gave the faculty and students opportunity to connect with academics, share their research work and listen to experts in the field. The centennial year cultural programmes included Natya Mahotsav (4 Days), Nritya Mahotsav (2 days) and Sangeet Mahotsav (3 days). It was a great opportunity for the faculty, students, and well-wishers of the university to enjoy the expression of art by renowned artists in respective fields.



Faculty participated in seminars and conferences, chaired sessions and presented 365 papers. During the year, faculty members published 168 journal articles, 57 books, book chapters, 53 papers in conference proceedings and 15 other publications giving evidence of their engagement with their discipline.

The University had 39 international visitors and 14 faculty members and senior officers as well as 3 students visited overseas institution for academic purposes. One MOU was signed with Commonwealth of Learning (COL), Canada for developing TEL Policy.

Maharshi Karve library uploaded 144 theses on Shodhganga repository. A total of 7445 books were added to the existing collection of the library making the total number of books 402153. The 58 online databases were made available to students and faculty members.

We are proud of our teachers who have been awarded for excellent work or have been placed in important committees and bodies in recognition of their expertise.

We are delighted to see two of our students (one Ph.D. with 1st Prize and 1 PG with 2nd Prize) and one teacher (1st Prize) winning awards at Awishkar research contest. At National level research competition Anveshan, 3 Ph. D. students received 2nd Rank. In Indradhanushya cultural festival, University team secured 5 major awards at the 13th Indradhanushya State Level Inter University Youth Festival, held at Rashtra Sant Tukdoji Maharaj University, Nagpur from January 22-26, 2016 after competing with 20 Universities in Maharashtra.

The State Level Inter University Disaster Preparedness programme (Avhan) for the NSS Volunteers of 35 districts from 19 Universities of Maharashtra was hosted by the SNDT Women's University Mumbai from May 25-June 3, 2015. The SNDT Women's University successfully met this challenge to the satisfaction of both trainees and expert trainers. After the rigorous training, these 1120 NSS volunteers became part of Chancellor's Brigade.

The Centennial year was celebrated with great pomp and funfair as well as serious academic activities. SNDTWU values quality in all its activities and welcomes talented professionals and academically eager youth into its fold.



Bharat Ratna Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve (18•4•1858 - 9•11•1962)

SNDT Women's University established in 1916 heralded the beginning of formal higher education for women in India and South-East Asia. The institution was the fruition of the founder, Maharshi Dr. Dhondo Keshav Karve's vision for the empowerment of women. The realization was possible with the financial support of the philanthropist Sir Vithaldas Thackersey. The headquarters of the University is at the Churchgate campus in Mumbai and the other two campuses are located at Juhu, Mumbai and Maharshi Karve Road, Pune.

Founder of the University

Bharat Ratna Maharshi Dhonde KeshavKarve (April 18, 1858 - Nov 9, 1962) was a Humanist, an evangel of emancipation both for Hindu widows and for womanhood at large. A pioneering figure moved by the magnificent instinct that upheld the progress of womanhood as the purest and surest test of the progress of civilization, the establishment of Shreemati Nathibai Damodhar Thackersey Indian Women's University was the culmination of an odyssey, which began with the establishment of Hindu Widow's Home Association in 1896 and the Mahila Vidyalaya in 1907. The Women's University was sculpted along the lines of the Women's University in Tokyo. The founding father advocated women's education as instrumental in women's empowerment by enabling them to be economically independent and to be able to think for themselves.

Presidential Address By Maharshi Dhondo Keshav Karve at 29th Indian National Social Congress on December 30, 1915

Excerpts from Presidential Address on 'Need for establishing Women's University'

Maharshi Karve was invited to deliver Presidential Address at the Indian National Social Congress on December 30, 1915. Here he presented his thoughts on the need for higher education for women.

In this Centennial Year Annual Report, we present excerpts related to need for Women's University from his Presidential Address and its relevance in today's context also cannot be questioned.

We cannot help changing. In spite of ourselves we are not to-day what we have been. "Why not then change intelligently" asked the reformer. It is the privilege of man alone to consciously adjust himself with his surroundings, and all that the reformer does in the case of social life is to consciously probe social evils and devise, as an intelligent being, means to remove them. This is a phase of the movement that is not confined to any single community. Let no one therefore labour under the misconception that reform is an undermining of faith and violence to the susceptibilities of the religious and righteous.

Maharshi Karve emphasized, "The importance of female education in India cannot be overrated; and we have observed with pleasure the evidence which is now afforded of an increased desire on the part of many of the natives of India to give a good education to their daughters. By this means a far greater proportional impulse is imparted to the educational and moral tone of the people than by the education of men."

The first thing that we ought to look to therefore is universal education. No readjustment of the social policy is possible unless every man, woman and child in the land is able at least to read, write and reckon. It is a matter of deep regret that during this period of sixty years, Government was not able to show any very assuring results and that the ratio of boys and girls receiving education should even now stand at 5:1. We must of course recognize, and recognize with sincere gratitude, that but for the initiative taken by Government in the matter, things should perhaps have continued to stand as they were in times past. All the little progress that has been made till now had been impossible but far the efforts however inadequate and perhaps half-hearted of the educational department. If I have on the present occasion to express dissatisfaction at the achievement have done we are thankful for. But we cannot at the same time help feeling that, considering the means at their disposal and the noble and generous spirit of the dispatch of 1854, what they have done is miserably little. They have not, it must be pointed out, displayed on-tenth of the activity in the cause of women's education that they have in that of men's though even the latter falls immensely short of the needs of the country.

The question of education of girls and women in India, in itself delicate and difficult, is rendered more so by certain prejudices and social customs. The force of the latter would indeed be reduced to a minimum, if the active sympathy of the women of India were enlisted in the matter. Happily, for us, the day has now come when many of our sisters would come forward to help and co-operate in the promotion of any scheme for women's education, provided they were rightly approached and their help sought in the right spirit. The question




would not now offer insurmountable difficulties, in as much as the desirability of women's education has come to be very widely recognized and the parents' solicitude for the education of their girls has immensely increased in recent years. If in these circumstances government took up the question of women's education in the spirit of the memorable dispatch and come forward with greater sympathy and greater liberality to help it on, influential persons and private bodies would be ready to supplement the action of Government, if they received encouragement and aid by way of grants. This Conference will, I trust consider the desirability of taking up the question in right earnest, asking the Government to give its best consideration to the suggestions made in the memorial of July last, to which I have already referred. The conference will also do well to formulate definite views on the subject and place them before the Government. It is not possible for me to place before you at this stage a cut and dry scheme for your acceptance, but I may be permitted to suggest the lines on which the education of Indian girls and women may very profitably be organized and efforts made, on our own part, to facilitate the spread of that education over a large area.

I am afraid the present policy of government in this matter is to look more to the quality than to quantity a policy that in the present conditions of India is perhaps too good to be useful in the attainment of the end in view. India is proverbially a land of famines. But never was the dearth of material food so sore as that of the food of the mind. Indian children, particularly girls, are starved educationally. It is really very strange that the government of the land should discuss the quality of the food-stuff when the need of the hour demands any edible article just to keep body and soul together. Not an ideally efficient education, but a sort of rough and easy education that is what is immediately wanted. Let every boy and girl learn the mere rudiments, the three Rs and we shall be content for the present. The complaint that is often heard by way of justification of the present state of things is the want of trained women teachers. But that complaint only emphasized the fact that the subject of women's education has been all along neglected.

What I would suggest to this conference to press upon the attention of Government is that they should realize the peculiar nature of Indian conditions. Unless the number of girls' school is increased so as to make education easily accessible to every girl, no appreciable progress can be expected. It is no longer so much the parents' apathy as the want of provision that is to blame.

As for trained women teachers, it must be borne in mind that the majority of candidates for training comes from widows. If the age limit were raised to thirty, many of those who begin their course late in life might join training colleges and would make decent teachers. The number of training institutions too must be multiplied and candidates admitted with greater leniency than at present. The rigour and strictness of standard that might safely be adopted in the case of men ought not to be resorted to in that of women. We cannot afford at the present day to aim at the highest. Let us admit every candidate that possesses the minimum of educational qualification. At any rate for the lowest grade no higher standard be demanded. One who can impart knowledge of the rudiments should be welcome. Where the end is wider diffusion, why not make the best of the material that is available?

I am afraid, however, that no conceivable increase in the number of girls' schools and of women's training colleges can, in any near future, bring education to the doors of every girl. If even in the case of boys, for every village with a school there are four that are without it, it will be too long before every village has a girls' school. I would therefore, suggest what appears to me a practical measure. We ought to go in for co-education of boys and girls in the primary schools, at any rate in the lower forms. If girls were admitted to boys' schools for the primary standards, women's education would advance by strides. I am aware that girls are at present admitted to some boys' schools when admission is sought, but that is not enough. I do not think I am wrong when I say that neither Government nor people have made any special efforts to make use of this means for girls' education. If efforts are made to induce people to send their girls to boys' schools, primary education



Turning to the secondary education in the case of women, I have to observe that no education, different from that given in high schools and colleges affiliated to the several universities primarily intended for men, is given to women. Those women who have the time, money and inclination, and can afford to go high enough on this ladder, are welcome to follow these courses of study, and our society will be the better for them. But the number of such ladies will necessarily be very small, in as much as secondary education at present is comparatively very costly and the courses of study are in many ways unsuited to the needs of our women. The majority of these take to married life and have to enter upon their duties in the household as wives and mothers. The one defect, however, of the present course of secondary education, that is perhaps the most disastrous in its effects, is that of the medium of instruction. It is indeed a very painful anomaly. It has been sapping the energies and undermining intellectual caliber of our youths all these years. I wonder the educational experts with the Government have not yet seriously noticed it. In the case of boys there are perhaps reasons, other than educational, which may reconcile us to the present state of things though the evils are but too apparent to a careful observer. These reasons, however, do not exist in the case of girls, most of whom will be called upon to fill the humbler office of the upholder of homes and hearths. The strain involved in receiving instruction through a foreign tongue that tells so severely upon the boys is bound to do greater harm to the girls. We cannot afford to have the future motherhood of the land thus enfeebled and enervated by this extra and uncalled-for strain. We ought to devise a system of education that will ensure all the food of the present course and yet will be free from its evils. In this respect, I have my own ideas based upon my experience of the last twenty years and may suggest a scheme of my own. But before we proceed to that, let me say what can be done taking the course as it is for a wider diffusion of secondary education among our women. Government my throw open boys' High Schools for girls, and instruct head-masters to admit them when they seek admission. Experiments of the kind have been tried and proved interesting. The New English School at Poona had at one time twenty ladies from the lowest to the highest standard receiving education along with boys. A similar experiment is now under trial at the Deccan Education Society's new English School at Satara. This would obviate the necessity of sending girls away from home. It is certainly of greater benefit for girls to live with their parents and be educated in a boys' school than that they should forego the influences of the home in order to avail themselves of education at a distant girls' school.

As regards higher education of women, I do not see why the present conditions should not continue. Women that are anxious to reap the benefit of college education may well do so by joining

Arts colleges for men, as at present they do, separate Arts colleges for women at this stage appear to me quite unnecessary. The money necessary for the maintenance of separate Arts colleges for women might far more profitably be utilized in instituting special scholarships for women and in increasing the number of high schools for girls. A separate medical college for women such as that proposed to be established at Delhi is, however, a great need.

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Permit me now, ladies and gentlemen, to place before you approximately my idea of secondary and higher education for women. It is based fundamentally upon the recognition of two principles. (1) That the most natural and therefore efficient medium of instruction is the learner's mother tongue. (2) And secondly, that women as a class have different functions to fulfil in the social economy from those of men. These two principles will commend themselves to all dispassionate thinkers and have been accepted by educational experts. Whenever the day for the wholesale adoption of vernaculars as media of instruction through-out the whole educational course for boys comes, we ought not to wait for it in the case of girls. There are no political or economic reasons present and the sooner we begin to impart all education primary, secondary higher to girls through the vernaculars, the better, it will be for the race. The second principle too is of vital importance. I do not mean that the way should be rigorously barred against those, whose ambition would be to beat men on their own ground and compete with them for prizes and honours in the existing Universities. Those who would be in a position by intellectual, physical and financial equipment to do so, would certainly be glorious ornaments to their kind and also to the whole community in the present conditions. But we must recognize that both national and social economy required that women should occupy a station of their own distinct from that of men. That they are as integral a part of the social organism as men, is beyond question, but that the office they have to fill is different, though equal perhaps greater in importance is equally true. If men and women therefore, are to be fitted by education to bear their own respective shares in the preservation, development and evolution towards perfection of the whole community, they must be brought up on two different lines. The differentiation in the educational courses must correspond in time and nature approximately to the differentiation in their conscious individuality. This does not imply, let me assure you that the two lines of education should be absolutely independent of each other and mutually exclusive. For after all, whether men or women, they are member of mankind and as such they are at bottom one. In social functions, in life's responsibility and in spheres of work they may differ; but in spirit, in humanity they are one. As far, therefore, as the development and unfolding of their common human nature is concerned, their education must take a common form and shape. They both have to work together hand in hand side by side towards the attainment of the ultimate purpose of the race in the order of creation and have therefore certain common endowments. To call them into play, to foster the instincts, impulses, emotions and faculties, their education too must be common. All the latter differentiation must have under it, about it and within it the common life and soul. In fact, the courses must be like two branches on one and the same stem and must be fed and sustained by the same vital sap. Neither men's nor women's education, therefore, can be sound if it absolutely dissociated from the other. The two must be correlated and co-ordinated must be wedded so as to be two in order to be one.

"We cannot support another movement which aims at the so-called emancipation of women. In opposition to this tendency, we lay emphasis on home life as the chief sphere of a woman's activities. Here her proper place is found as wife and mother, not indeed as a tool or ornament, but as an active partaker in the humanitarian and national spirit, which should animate a home. Our aim is to educate women that they shall come to realize their own special mission in life as free personal agents and as members of the Empire of Japan and that, as such, they shall be able to perform their services as wives and mothers in a larger sense and more efficient manner than hitherto.

"But at the same time, we must remember there will always be women who, owing to various reasons, do not marry. To these we must give room for realizing their mission in life and utilizing their own peculiar personal abilities. We must recognize their spheres of activity as legitimate, and not as existing on sufferance, and their lives as having important mission for the nation and the community at large."



Thus, the principles, which shall govern us in educating women, are:

First to educate them as human beings, personalities, secondly, to educate them as women in order to fit them to become good wives and wise mothers; and thirdly to educate them as members of the nation so that they may always remember that their lives at home are related in an important manner, however hidden, to the prosperity or decay of the nation.

In framing these secondary and higher courses of studies, we may be guided by the Japan Women's University. A prudent and practical Japanese thinker and worker, Mr. Naruse, conceived the idea of this University and with immense patience and perseverance made it a success to the great advantage of the Japanese nation. So far as our women are concerned our circumstances are very similar to those of Japan and we can profitably turn for guidance to institutions conducted by those people rather than to schools and colleges for women in the West. The Japan Women's University has a complete course of studies beginning with standards for the kindergarten school and ending with a three years' course for post graduate studies. Kindergarten for children from 3 to 5 elementary school course extending over six years high school course of five years, college course for three years, and post graduate courses from one to three years. You will be interested to hear that the number of institutions under

It is impossible to check the growing disparity in the education of our men and women unless vigorous efforts are made to spread secondary education among women far and wide through the medium of the vernaculars. Men's secondary and higher education are sure to advance by leaps and bounds, while the advance in women's education in these departments cannot but be nominal if carried on only along the present lines. When women are not intelligent enough to sympathetically appreciate men's enterprises, when they are unable to bear their share in the progress of the nation or reform of society, men cannot but be handicapped in whatever they do. There has always been complaint that we have been living double lives, one at home and one outside. The only way in which this can be remedied is to educate women properly, so that they may be real and intelligent partners in our views and actions. In the way of the balanced progress of society, this disparity is a great stumbling block and the sooner we remove it the better.

I would appeal therefore to Indian States, to public bodies, to private Institutions and to men interested in the social amelioration of the country, to take up the matter without further delay, and start experiments which are bound to succeed if only they are pursued with a firm grip.

They will yet save the situation if they lose no time in empty discussions. Let them set to work practically. When they have some work already done to show, I feel sure, Government will not be tardy in extending their helping hand to them. The matter is of such grave urgency and far reaching import, that I would urge it on the Conference to take it in hand and to appoint a committee to formulate a scheme with all its details clearly reasoned out and to suggest ways and means to found vernacular high schools and colleges on the lines here advocated. Women's education has sufficiently advanced now for us to take the step.

In this connection I am very happy to say that I have been authorized by the managing committee of the Hindu Widows' Home Association to announce to this conference that they are prepared to start, by way of an experiment in the direction, college classes as the natural development of their MahilaAshrama or Girl's High School. What makes me feel still happier is that already a contribution of no less than ten thousand





rupees has been promised by one of my colleagues at the MahilaAshrama. The letter he has addressed to me, comes as a very auspicious augury, synchronizing, as it does, with the inception of the new idea. The moment appears to be opportune, and my friend's contribution is a circumstance that is, to my vision, a sacred intimation, that the institution, if started, would not be allowed to die for want of funds – for want of sympathy and co-operation by my countrymen.

आपल्या देशाला परंपरा आहे व होती. जगातल्या ४७ संस्कृर्तींपैकी ४४ संस्कृर्तीं नष्ट झाल्याय एकच संस्कृर्तीं शिल्लक राहिली ती भारतीय संस्कृर्तीं! ही भारतीय संस्कृर्तीं याकरीता शिल्लक राहिली ह्याचं कारण भारतीय शिक्षण-पद्धती! भारतीय शिक्षण-पद्धतीमध्ये जे ज्ञान प्रत्यक्ष-अप्रत्यक्ष दिलं जायचं त्या ज्ञानातून या देशाची संस्कृर्ती टिकून राहिली. हे खरं आहे की १८३ २ मध्ये प्रयन्त केला की जर या देशाचा घात करायचा असेल तर आणि देशाला संपवायचं असेल तर शिक्षण-पद्धतीत बदल करावा! आपण जर नीतिमत्तेवर आधारित मूल्याधिष्ठित शिक्षणपद्धती बंद करू शकलो आणि कागदाच्या पदवीवर प्रेम करणारी व्यवस्था निर्माण करू शकलो, तरच हा देश मागे पडेल हे त्यांना ठाऊक होते! तिथून सुरुवात झाली कागदाच्या पदवीवर प्रेम करणारी शिक्षणपद्धती! मला अभिमान आहे की या विद्यापीठामध्ये आपण इन्व्हेंशनला महत्त्व देता, इनोव्हेशनला महत्त्व देता!

मी एक पुस्तक वाचत होतो. त्या पुस्तकातलं एक वाक्य मला फार आवडलं. त्या पुस्तकात लेखकाने असं लिहिलं की आधीच्या काळानुसार विद्वान कोण? ज्ञानी कोण? ज्याच्याकडे ज्ञान असायचं तो विद्वान, ज्याच्याकडे ज्ञान असायचं तो ज्ञानी! पण आता ही व्याख्या बदलली आहे. आता एखादा आयफोन हातात असलेल तर त्या आयफोनमध्ये सुद्धा आपण ज्ञान बघू शकतो. मग आता ज्ञानी कोण? तर तो असं लिहितो की आता ज्ञानी आणि विद्वान फक्त ज्ञान असणारा नाही! ज्याला कल्पकता आहे, ज्याला इमॅजिनेशन आहेय असणाऱ्या ज्ञानाचा उपयोग जो स्वत:साठी, स्वत:च्या परिवारासाठी, देशासाठी, समाजासाठी करू शकतो तो ज्ञानी आहे. अन्यथा दिल्लीमध्ये एका निर्भयावर अत्याचार होतो, अन्याय होतो, बसच्या बाहेर त्या निर्भयाला फेकलं जातं आणि समाजमन २१ व्या शतकात ८२: साक्षर असणार्या देशात दीड तास त्या माझ्या बहिणीला मदत करायला कोणी जात नाही! ही शिक्षण पद्धती आपल्याला अपेक्षित नाही.

माझ्या चंद्रपूर गावात, महाराष्ट्राच्या शेवटच्या टोकावर, विजेच्या तारेला स्पर्श झाला म्हणून एक माकडाचं पिल्लू करंट लागून खाली पडलं. सारी माकडं एक झाली. तिथून जर एखादा स्कुटरवाला जायचा प्रयत्न करत असेल तर ते दात विचकायचे! अरे जे माकडांना समजतं ते मनुष्याला समजत नसेल तर अशी शिक्षण पद्धती मला आणि तुम्हाला अपेक्षित नाही. एज्युकेशन याचा अर्थ इंजेक्शन होता कामा नये की वरुन इंजेक्शनच्या रुपामध्ये ज्ञान भरतोय!! एज्युकेशनचा अर्थ इंजेक्शन नव्हे! जेव्हा इंजेक्शनचा वापर होतो तेव्हा मग इन्फेक्शनची सुद्धा भीती निर्माण होते. शिक्षणक्षेत्रात इन्फेक्शन इंजेक्शन आयू शकत नाही. एज्युकेशनचा अर्थ असा आहे आत्म्याचा विकास! ८४ लक्ष योनीच्या श्रेष्ठ योनीमध्ये जन्म घेतल्यावर ह्या शिक्षणपद्धतीतून पद्धतीतून आपण काय करू शकतो ह्याचा विचार करायला हवा आणि म्हणूनच आपल्या देशामध्ये प्रत्येक महामानवाने शिक्षणाला महत्व दिलं पाहिजे. जेव्हा जगात कुठे शिक्षणपद्धती नव्हती, तेव्हा आपल्या देशात नालंदा, तक्षशिला विद्यापीठे होती. चौथ्या शतकात चिनी प्रवाशाने त्याचे वर्णन केलं आहे.

दुर्वैवाने आज जगातल्या पहिल्या २०० विद्यापीठांमध्ये आपला नंबर नाहीये! आणि म्हणूनच व्हाईस चॅन्सलर मॅडमनी जेव्हा मला निमंत्रण दिलं, तेव्हा मला निमंत्रण का दिलं हा माझ्यासमोर प्रश्न होता! मी हायर एज्युकेशनचा मिनिस्टर नाहीये, पण नंतर माझ्या लक्षात आलं की विद्यापीठाला शंभर वर्ष पूर्ण झाली आहेत आणि शताब्दिनिमित्त आपण काही प्रकल्प हाती घेत आहेत! तिथे मात्र माझं काम आहे! तिथे मात्र वित्त मंत्री म्हणून माझं काम आहे! आपण १२ भाषांसाठी भाषाभवन, विज्ञानसंस्था, डिझाईनसंस्था, ज्ञानोटेकनॉलॉजी संस्था उभारू इच्छित आहेत! मी तुम्हाला निश्चितपणे वित्तमंत्री म्हणून आश्वस्थ करतो की शंभर वर्ष झाल्याच्या या उपक्रमामध्ये



मी सुद्धा तुमच्या सोबत आहे. तुम्हाला यासाठी लागणारे जे जे म्हणून पैसे आहेत ते मी निश्चितपणे उपलब्ध करून देईन! मला कार्यक्रमाला निमंत्रण दिलं म्हणून नाही तर शिक्षणावर प्रेम करणारा मी एक कार्यकर्ता आहे, मला याची जाणीव आहे म्हणून! वैराण्यमूर्ती गाडगे बाबा त्यांचं काय सुंदर वाक्य होतं, ते म्हणायचे, ''एक लुगडं कमी घाला, पण आपल्या मुलांच्या आणि मुर्लीच्या शिक्षणासाठी पैसे कमी पडू देऊ नका.'' महामानव डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर म्हणायचे, ''तुमच्या हातात २ रूपये असतील तर पोटाची भूक शमविण्यासाठी १ रूपया भाकरीवर खर्च करा, पण १ रूपया मात्र जीवन कस जगावं यासाठी पुस्तकावर खर्च करा!'' क्रांतीबाई सावित्रीबाई फुले यांचं नाव पुणे विद्यापीठाला देण्यासाठी मी विधानसभेत संघर्ष केला. राष्ट्रसंत तुकडोजी महाराजांचं नाव नागपूर विद्यापीठाला देण्यासाठी संघर्ष केला आणि यश प्राप्त केलं! मी वैराण्यमूर्ती गाडगेबाबांचं नाव अमरावती विद्यापीठाला द्यावं म्हणून संघर्ष केला. क्रांतीज्योती सावित्रीबाई फुले यांनी जर तेव्हा मुलींना शिक्षण दिलं नसतं तर आज या साठ हजार विद्यार्थिनी या विद्यापीठामध्ये शिक्षण घेऊ शकल्या नसत्या. त्यांना एक स्वतःच्या पायावर उभं करण्याची ऊर्जा या शिक्षणातून दिली.

आज महिला कुठेही मागे नाहीत. मला एकुलती एक मुलगी आहे आणि माझं ते सर्वात मोठं धन आहे! यापेक्षा मोठा धन असूच शकत नाही. मुलगा एका घराचा दिवा आणि वंश मानला जातो आणि मुलगी मात्र दोन परिवारांची वंश मानली जाते. मुलगा चुकू शकतो पण मुलगी आयुष्यात चुकूच शकत नाही, हे एका तत्वचिंतकाने सांगितलं ते खरं आहे; कारण आपल्याला माहित आहे, ''स्त्रीजन्मा ही तुझी कहाणी, हृदयी करूणा नयनी पाणी!'' भावनाप्रधान असणारी ही स्त्री ईश्वराने निर्माण केली ही ईश्वरीय कलाकृतीमधली अतीशय सर्वांगसुंदर कलाकृती आहे! मला आठवत की माझ्या मुलीने जेव्हा एम.बी.बी. एस. ला जायची इच्छा व्यक्त केली तेव्हा मी सांगितलं, 'जाऊ नको', कारण तेव्हा पुस्तकं पाहिली की मलाच भीती वाटायची! पण ती म्हणाली, ''नाही बाबा, मला जायचंच आहे''. आमच्या घरी सर्वच जण एम.बी.बी.एस. डॉक्टर आहेत. माझे वडील, भाऊ, मामा, मामी .. मी सोडून सर्वच डॉक्टर आहेत. मी म्हटलं, ''का जायचं आहे?'' तर म्हणाली, ''बाबा, तुम्ही डाक्टर झाला नाहीत, पण तुमचं स्वप्न मी पूर्ण करणार!'' मी म्हटलं, ''काय करशील?'' तर म्हणाली, ''समाजसेवा करेन!'' ७०% पैसे घेऊन पेशंट तपासेन आणि ५०% फुकट तपासेन.'' आताच ती नुकतीच एम.बी.बी.एस. फायनल झाली. तिने जेव्हा पदवी घेतली, तेव्हा मला जितका आनंद मंत्रीपदाची शपथ घेताना झाला, त्यापेक्षा १० पट आनंद झालाय कारण कदाचित जे काम मी करू शकणार नाही, ती दुबळ्यांची सेवा ती औषध देऊन करू शकेल. जीवन अनमोल आहे! मी एखाद्याचं जीवन वाचवण्यासाठी कमी पडू शकेन, पण एक डॉक्टर मुलगी मात्र दुसऱ्याचं जीवन वाचवण्यासाठी पूर्ण शक्तीने काम करू शकेल.

आज आपण जेव्हा ज्ञान घेत आहात तेव्हा लक्षात ठेवा! एका लेखकाने असं म्हटलं, ''जो थोडा पढता है वह गांव छोड देता है, जो जादा पढता है वह राज्य छोड देता है, और जो बहुत जादा पढता है, वह देश छोड देता है!'' स्वामी विवेकानंदांची एक गोष्ट मला फार आवडते! विवेकानंद म्हणायचे, ''देशभक्ती म्हणजे काय? देशभक्ती म्हणजे जब आप रात में बिस्तर पर सोते हो तब आप को ऐसा लगता है कि आज भी हमारे देश में अज्ञान है, दारिर्द्य है, गरिबी है तो समझ लेना आपके मन में देशभक्ति का अंकुर जग गया है। दुसरे दिन जब आप सोते हो तब आप सोचतो हो कि सूरज ना बन पाए तो दीपक बन के जलता चल। मैं दुनिया को बदल नही सकता, सारी बरसात रोकने की क्षमता मुझमें नही हैंय पर मैं अपने आप पर छाता तो ले सकता हूँ। दुनिया मे निर्धनता है, गरीबी है, दुख है, वेदना है, इस दुनिया के सारे दुखों की वेदना को मैं बदल नही सकता पर इतना तो कर सकता हूँ कि मै सुरज नही बन सकता पर दीपक बन कर मेरे आसपास जो समस्या है, उसको तो सुलझा शकता हूँ, ऐसा अगर मन में आता हैं, और आप कुछ प्लान बनाते हो, तो देशभक्ति के आपके इस अंकुर को पत्ते आ जार्येगे। तिसरे दिन जब आप सोचते हो कि मुझे कुछ तो भी काम करना है, मैं एक व्यक्ति के जीवन में अंधेरा दूर करते हुए प्रकाश निर्माण करूंगा तो समझ जाना कि आपके इतना बडा कोई देशभक्त नहीं है।

मी आता यज्ञाची गोष्ट सांगून मी माझ्या भाषणाला विराम देईन. एका गावात यज्ञ झाला, संपला, पूर्णाहुती झाली आणि तिथे सफाई करणारी एका महिला चुकून तिथे थुंकली. आता ती थुंकली ती यज्ञ कुंडात! तिच्या लक्षात आलं की यज्ञकुंडात ती जिथे थुंकली, तिथे सोनं झालं तिने उचललं आणि तिला वाटलं की इथे शक्ती आहे आणि सोन्याचं नाणं तयार होतं. मग दुसर्या दिवशी पुन्हा सफाई करताना थुंकली, पुन्हा सोन्याचं नाणं! तिसरं, चौथं, पाचवं... तिच्याकडे सोनं झालं ही गोष्ट तर लपली नाही. बाकीच्याही महिलांच्या लक्षात आलं की हिच्याकडे सोनं कसं काय होतंय? मग त्यांनी लपून पाहिलं तर ही थुंकली तर सोन्याचं नाणं होतं. मग बाकिच्यांनीही तेच सुरू केलं. तिथे थुंकायचं, सोन्याचं नाणं घ्यायचं! पण गावात मात्र एक महिला द्विधा मनस्थितीत होती. तिचा नवरा म्हणायचा, हे करू नको, हे पाप आहे, हे चूक आहे, हे वाईट आहे! एक दिवस तिने नवऱ्याचं ऐकलं, दुसऱ्या दिवशी ऐकलं, तिसऱ्या दिवशी म्हणाली, ''नाही माझ्याने होत नाही! सर्वाना सोनं सापडतंय आणि मी मात्र मागे राहते. आता हे काही मला सहन होत नाही. '' मग नवरा म्हणाला, ''असं असेल तर आपण गाव सोडू, पण तुला मात्र मी काही परवानगी देत नाही!'' जेव्हा मात्र गाव सोडण्यासाठी ते निघाले, गावापासून दूर थोडे टेकडीवर गेले, उंचावर गेले, त्या महिलेच्या मनात विचार आला की गाव तर सोडतेय, एकदा बघून तर घेते गावाकडे! मागे पाहिलं तर सारं गाव आगीत भरमसात होत होतं! नवऱ्याला तिने विचारलं, ''गाव आगीत का भरमसात होतंय?'' नवरा म्हणाला, ''कारण साधं आहे! जोपर्यंत त्या गावात तुझ्यासारखी चांगला विचार करणारी स्त्री होती, तोपर्यंत ते गाव देवाने टिकवलं. जेव्हा चांगुलपणा संपला, तेव्हा देव ते गाव कधीच टिकवत नाही!'' जर आपल्याला देश टिकवायचा असेल, समाज घडवायचा असेल, तर जग काय जग काय करेल मला माहित नाही, मी चांगलं वागलं पाहिजे!

एकाने म्हटलं ते खर आहे, 'दुनिया को बदलने वालों को आप ढुंढ रहे हो, तो मत ढुंढो। एक बार अपने आपको आईने में देख लो। दुनिया को बदलनेवाला मिल जाएगा! छोटी सोच पैर में मोंच! छोटी सोच इन्सान को आज नही बढने नहीं देती।' विचार मोठा करा! माझं उद्दिष्ट काय? आणि हा उद्देश जर आपण आपल्या हृदयात निर्माण केला तर आपल्याला कोणीही मोठं होण्यापासून रोखू

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शकत नाही. 'मोठे होणं' याचा अर्थ कागदी नोटा कमावणं नव्हे. वित्तमंत्री म्हणून जास्त लोकांना रोजगार मिळावा म्हणून मी प्रयन्त करतो. माझ्याकडे वनखातंही आहे, नुसतं कागदी नोटाही देत नाही तर कागदी नोटा ज्या कागदापासून होतात तो कागद ज्या लाकडापासून होतो तर तेही माझ्याचकडे आहे. माझ्याकडे वित्त खातही आहे आणि चित्त खातंही आहे आणि चित्त चांगलं ठेवण्याची जबाबदारीही आहे! यशस्वी जीवनाची व्याख्या एका शायराने दोन वाक्यात सांगितली... 'ऐसी जिंदगी ना जिओ कि लोग आपकी फर्याद करें। ऐसी जिंदगी ना जिओ कि लोग आपकी फर्याद करें। ऐसी जिंदगी जिओ कि लोग बार बार आपको याद करें। फिर-फिर से आपको याद करें।'

माझ्या आपल्या सर्वाना मनापासून शुभकामना! आपण खूप यशस्वी व्हावं खूप मोळ्या व्हाव्या! मला आज आनंद आहे, हे माझ सौभाग्य आहे की तुमचं अभिनंदन करण्याची संधी मला मॅडमनी प्राप्त करून दिली! हा एक योगायोग आहे की वसुधाताई आणि वंदनाताई या दोधींचाही नावामध्ये 'व्ही' आहे. जर ते 'व्ही' पासून नाव लिहीत असतील तर 'व्ही' पासून व्हिक्टरी आहे आणि डब्लू पासून लिहीत असतील तर 'विन' आहे! त्या शताब्दी महोत्सवाचे नेतृत्व करत आहेत, तेव्हा या विद्यापीठाच्या सर्व साठ हजार विद्यार्थिनी-भगिनींना आयुष्यात व्हिक्टरीच प्राप्त व्हावी! प्रत्येक संकटावर, प्रत्येक समस्येवर यश प्राप्त व्हावं, अशी मी शुभकामना देतो आणि आपल्या सर्वाना खूप खूप अंत:करणापासून शुभेच्छा देतो.

Director Dr. Kesarkar, Finance and Accounts Officer Dr. Ruby Ojha, Prof. Shobha Udipi and all other dignitaries on the stage, senior professors and teachers who inspire lives with their knowledge and students with their young and restless blood who will build the future of this country. At today's convocation ceremony, I would like to offer my heartfelt congratulations and good wishes to all those who completed their degrees. On this occasion I would like to pray to Siddhivinayak for the fulfilment of the wishes and prayers of everyone's hearts. I pray that everyone is given happiness, success, and the strength to bring their dreams to fruition. I am delighted to be amongst all of you today. Let me offer them my sincerest congratulations to all the gold medallists whom we have felicitated until now! To be honest, all of you are extremely lucky because this year, the University celebrates a hundred years since its inception. This University was established on July 5, 1916 with a mere five students. Hundred years later, there are fifteen thousand women who are completing their undergraduate and postgraduate degrees and diplomas. I have been told that this convocation ceremony is being telecast to several other locations at this very moment. Let me offer my congratulations to all those newly graduated students who are watching us but are not with us here today. I would like to sing a slightly modified version of a Hindi film song here today. The original song goes: "Papa kehtein hain bada naam karega". I would make a slight change and sing, "Papa kehtein hain bada naam karegi/ Beti hamari aisa kaam karegi".

I once read a story of which I still remember every detail as clearly as when I first came across it. Let me recount it to you. The earth was created four hundred and fifty-six crore years ago. God was adding to his creation each day. Sometimes, he would create trees and sometimes, wild animals. At times, he brought forth inanimate things and at times, living creatures. He was landscaping the earth, giving us rivers and mountains. In this manner, God brought our universe into being! However, creating the universe left God exhausted. He wondered to himself who would be capable of continuing his task of creating the world. That is when he birthed woman! He handed over the work of creation to her. I am standing in front of all my sisters here today who are the ones tasked with taking the world ahead and continuing God's task of creation.

Our country is and has always been very rich in tradition. Out of forty-five cultures of the world, up to forty-four have been ruined. The single culture that survived was Indian culture! The reason for this exceptional resilience of Indian culture is its system of education. Indian culture has survived by virtue of the values that it imparted directly and indirectly. It is a fact that in 1832, the British realised that the only way to destroy India was to change the Indian education system. If the ethical and moral bases of education are destroyed and people are taught to value education solely for their degree certificates, then this country can be kept underdeveloped. This is how an education system was created which values only degree certificates that are ultimately no more than mere pieces of paper. However, I am proud of this university's commitment to invention and innovation.

I was reading a book recently. I remember a sentence from the book which I loved and which I would like to share with you. The author had asked a question – "who was called a wise person in the olden times?" It was the one who possesses knowledge. But today, that definition no longer holds. Nowadays, if one has an iPhone, one may search for and find any information online. Knowledge as such can be accessible to anyone with access to a phone or the internet. So, how do we now identify the wise ones? The author writes that today the real wise ones are not those who merely possess knowledge. Rather, it is the one who has imagination and creativity – one who is able to use knowledge for themselves, their family,

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for their country, for their society. When Nirbhaya was raped in Delhi, after facing injustice, when she was thrown out of the bus, she lay there for an hour and a half without receiving any help or assistance from passers-by. This is in the twenty first century, in a country with eighty-two percent literacy rate. What use is such education? This is not the kind of education that we wish for.

In my native district, Chandrapur, which is at the very farthest corner of Maharashtra, a baby monkey touched a live wire and fell to the ground. The entire tribe of monkeys gathered around it. Even if someone wished to ride past on a scooter, the monkeys would ferociously bare their teeth. They united in their desire to protect this young one. If educated human beings cannot understand what even monkeys can understand, then neither you, nor me would want such an education. Education ought not to be like an injection - one cannot simply inject knowledge into a person! When education is reduced to an injection, then there is also the constant fear of catching an infection. There is no room for injection or infection in our education system. Education is development of a person's soul and no less. After eighty-four lakh births, one gets the fortune of being born as a human being and one must give serious thought to how a human being must be educated. And thus, every wise person in this country must give education its due importance. At that time in history, when there was no tradition of education, India had universities like Nalanda and Takshashila. Chinese travellers in the fourth century AD have described it in their travelogues.

Unfortunately, in the list of the topmost two hundred universities in the world, not even one Indian university is featured! This is why when I received an invitation from Madam Vice Chancellor, I had to wonder why I had been invited. I am not the Minister for Higher Education. But then I realised that the University has completed hundred years and hence, on the occasion of the centennial year, many new projects have been planned. In that matter

at least, I have some work to do as the Minister of Finance! The University wishes to establish a Language Centres for twelve languages, institutions for science, for design and for nanotechnology. As the Minister of Finance, I wish to assure you that as I am with you in this educational programme as the University completes its Centennial year. I ensure you that the funds required for all these projects will be provided to the University. Not for having invited me to this function but because I am devoted to the cause of education. There is a beautiful saving by Saint Gadge Baba, "Wear a cloth less but never spend less money on your children's education". The great man Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar used to say, "If you have two rupees in your hand, then spend one rupee on a bhakri satiate hunger but spend the other rupee on a book that will teach you how to live". I strove for the renaming of Pune University after the revolutionary Savitribai Phule and appealed for it in the Vidhan Sabha. I successfully fought to rename Nagpur University after the national saint Tukdoji Maharaj. I also struggled for the renaming of Amravati University after Saint Gadge Baba. If the revolutionary Savitribai Phule had not striven for women's right to education, these sixty thousand women would not have had any access to education. Their education has given them the strength to stand on their own two feet.

Today, there is no field in which women are behind men. I have only one child, a daughter, and she is my most precious treasure. There can be no bigger treasure than this. The son belongs to and takes forward the name of only one family, but the daughter takes the names of two families ahead. She belongs to two families. The son can go wrong but the daughter can never go wrong – this is the view of an eminent philosopher. As the saying goes, "This is the story of womanhood, compassion in the heart and tears in the eyes". These emotionally intelligent women are the finest creation in all universe. I remember that when my daughter informed me that she wanted to apply for an M.B.B.S. course, I told her not to do it. At that time, even the sight of medical books would



terrify me. But she replied to me, "No, baba, I want to do it". Many the people in my family have an M.B.B.S degree – my father, my brother, my aunt and uncle - everyone except for me. I asked her the reason for her wish. She replied, "Baba, you did not become a doctor but I wish to become one in order to fulfil your dreams". I asked her what she meant to do. She said, "I will serve society. I will charge fees only from fifty per cent of my patients. The other fifty per cent I will treat for free." Only recently, she completed her degree. The joy I felt on that occasion surpassed even the happiness I felt upon taking the oath of ministership. It is likely that she will be able to serve the marginalised masses in ways that I haven't been able to do. Life is very valuable. I might fall short when it comes to saving soemone's life but a doctor can work towards such a goal in a powerful way.

As you strive towards knowledge, keep in mind this author's warning – "One who studies a little leaves the village. One who studies a little more leaves the state. The most highly educated leave the country." There is a story by Swami Vivekananda which I highly esteem. Swami Vivekananda used to ask, "What does patriotism mean?" His answer was this - "On the first night, if you are left bereft of sleep by the thought of your country's continuing ignorance, injustice, poverty. It is when you lose sleep over such issues that the seed of patriotism has taken birth into your mind. On the next night, you begin to realise that even though you cannot be the very sun, then at least you can be a small lamp – I can't change the world, I don't have the capacity to halt the monsoon, but I can be an umbrella for myself. In this world there is no end of sorrow, pain and destitution. I cannot change all of that but as a small lamp, I can shed light over at least my immediate surroundings. I can at least solve the problems that are in my vicinity. If you begin to think in this manner and make up your mind to make some difference then you can say that the seed of patriotism in your mind has begun to sprout tender leaves. On the third night, if you resolve to act on these motivations and bring light even into one person's life, then there will be no truer patriot than you.

I will bring my speech to a conclusion with a small tale about a yajna. In a village, after a yajna had been successfully completed, the rituals performed and the sacrifice offered, a sweeper woman happened to be around the yajna kunda and accidently spat into it. When she looked into the kunda, she realised that in the kunda now lay shimmering gold. She picked it up and understands that there is some power at work in the kunda which makes spit into lustrous gold coins. Gradually, all other women in the village found this out and started spitting into the yajna kunda and collecting the resultant gold. But there was one woman in the village who found herself in a conflicted state of mind. Her husband told her not to follow the other women in their wrong and sinful doings. She listened to him on the first day, and the second day, but on the third day, she could no longer endure it. She confessed to him that she was direly tempted and at the end of her tether. She said, "While all the other women are collecting gold coins, I languish here. I cannot bear this any longer". Her husband replied, "If that is the case, we can leave this village. But I will not permit you in any condition to do as the others do".

When they had left the village behind and had reached a hill, she turned back to take one last look at the village that had been her home. What she saw shocked her – the entire village was up in flames. She asked her husband why the village was burning to ashes. Her husband answered, "The reason is simple. As long as you with your high and conscientious thoughts lived in the village, God kept the village safe. As soon as you left and the village was bereft of goodness, God did not wish to keep it anymore. Thus, if we want to preserve our village and our country, then we must conduct ourselves in a moral manner no matter what others do or do not do".

It is true that if one looks for those who can change the world, then one must give up that futile search. Gaze into the mirror and you will find the only one

who can make a difference. Never think small. Petty thinking is a curse that does not allow people to make any progress. Think big. If you decide upon your goal with determination, no one can stop you from making progress. As the Minister of Finance, I strive to make employment possible for as many people as possible. The charge of the Forest Department is also with me. I am not only concerned with printing currency notes, but also with the paper that makes those notes and the wood that makes that paper. In my care is not only the Finance Department but also the department of the mind. It is my responsibility to keep that mind pure. A sha'ir has given us the definition of a successful life. He tells us, "Live in such a manner that no one complains against you. Live in such a manner that people remember you at every step".

My sincerest wishes with all of you! I pray that all of you achieve success. It is my good fortune, my joy that Madam Vice Chancellor has given me this opportunity to congratulate you. It is coincidence that both Vasudhatai's and Vandanatai's names begin with a "v" which stands for "victory". In case they spell their names with a "w", then "w" also stands for "win". Since Vasudhatai and Vandanatai are the leaders of this university in its hundredth year, all the six thousand students of the university will definitely achieve success. I pray for every obstacle and adversity to be overcome. I offer to all of you my deepest and most heartfelt good wishes.

2. Announcement of Centennial Grant of Rs. 75 Crore by the Government of Maharashtr (May 11, 2016)

Mr. Sudhir Mungantiwar, Hon'ble Minister of Finance, GoM said in his Convocation Address at the 65th Convocation held on February 17, 2016 that the GoM is keen on supporting SNDTWU with a Centennial Grant. Vice Chancellor Prof. Vasudha Kamat had meetings with Hon'ble Minister and had submitted 8 proposals. The proposals for Rs. 75 Crores were accepted by the Hon'ble Minister. The Centennial Year Grant was announced by Mr. Vinod Tawde, Hon'ble Minister, Higher and Technical Education, GoM on May 11, 2016 at the occasion of Inauguration of Maharshi Karve Seminar Complex at the Churchgate campus announced a Centennial Year Grant of Rs. 75 Crores to SNDTWU.

3. Grade B by the NAAC to SNDT College of Arts and Commerce for Women, Pune

SNDTWU submitted its proposals and by April 2016 a grant amount of Rs 489,52,574 was transferred to SNDTWU.

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
7. Student Felicitation with 55 Gold Medals (February 17, 2016)

Academic Initiatives and Best practices

SNDT Women's University introduced many new academic initiatives like Vidyarthini Sahitya Sammelan (Student Literary Festival), Internship, Research at Masters level in the year 2013-14. These initiatives were continued and some new activities were started in the year 2015-16.

This section presents best practices of the departments and colleges which are used and proven for their effectiveness.

1. Film screening and discussions

Many departments do film screenings and have discussions on pertinent questions and issues raised which are relevant to their course of study. This generation of learners is more visually oriented and comfortable with all forms of media in a way that prior generations were not. For these reasons, the medium of films was chosen for a general education class.

Popular films reveal our ideals and expectations about social life in a myriad of ways. Some of the most common themes in contemporary films revolve around social life and the accompanying problems that living in today's society entails. Films are used in the classroom to help students make new connections and uncover truths about social life. Using film as a medium to study social life allows students to exercise their sociological imaginations in a way that is easily accessible and relevant. By making connections to their personal lives it can help them make sense of the world in which we live. An appealing aspect of using films and other fictional representations in this way is that it allows for critical analysis to be done by students themselves, rather than for them by others.

2. Lecture series

In order to offer our students latest insights into the emerging technologies and advancements, various faculties of SNDT University arrange for renowned experts to come and visit the university to deliver expert talks to our students. The experts from the industry share their knowledge, experience and latest practices implemented in various streams (as per the experts' field). The interactive sessions are a great way of bringing the industry exposure and expertise inside the class rooms. These expert talks help our students gain strong foothold in their respective discipline and help them stand out among the rest.

3. Study Visits

Many departments and conducted colleges take their students on educational visits to places which give a firsthand experience of the real world to the students.

The aim of study visits is to collect and exchange ideas and practices between the members of the network. The students have been found to get acquainted with the subject matter and deepen their knowledge.

During the year 173 Study visits were organized; 78 Study visits by the departments and 95 by the Colleges (Pl see section 20 on University Departments, Institutions and Colleges (page....)

4. Alumni Meet

Some departments have made an Alumni group. The alumni meetings are held at least once a year. This is platform where the students who have passed out share their experiences with the students and guide them on their career path. They extend help for the students' placement and industrial training. Alumni act as a bridge between the

college/departments and the industries for interaction on new developments in different disciplines. Alumni meets encourage and foster friendships and fellowship among the students, teachers, and administrative staff of the past and present.

5. Internship

In the year 2012-13, SNDT Women's University introduced Internship as a component in the Curricula of all post graduate programmes. The students of 2015-16 batch did their Internship during the fourth semester of their Master programme. Introduction of Internship under all Masters programmes has given an opportunity to students to observe the world of work closely and also introspect about her own skills and attitude as well as knowledge base required to work in an organization. Some students got the stipend for the internship; some students got offers and got absorbed in the organization after getting the degree. Many students did their internship in the same city where they lived but some did it in another city and some more outside the country as well.

This year 1642 Students did their Internship work 674 organisations/industries. These include departments, Colleges as well as Polytechnic.

6. Subject Associations

In the year 2014, it was proposed to establish Subject Associations in every post graduate department/institute. Main purpose of establishing Subject Associations was to bring together students studying that subject in the post graduate department and affiliated colleges where that subject was taught and learn more about it in informal way. Second purpose was to develop leadership qualities in students through various activities of the associations. These associations conducted several activities/programmes in their respective subject areas. Teachers in the department guided the students in organizing these programmes.

45 Subject Associations were established in 2014. In 2015 many programmes/activities were organized through these Associations. Student Led Seminar at Churchgate, and Student led Conference at Juhu campuses were held. Many other activities were organized by the subject associations such as workshops, visits, lectures by eminent experts in the field, film screening and discussion etc.

7. Vidyarthini Sahitya Sammelan

This year Vidyarthini Sahitya Sammealan was organized by the Language departments of Churchgate campus during February 6-8, 2016.

8. Student-Led Conferences

Student led Conference was a new concept introduced from the year 2014-15. This year post graduate departments on Churchgatecampus and Juhu campus came together to help students organize Student-led conferences. Each department had established Subject Association during the year 2014-15 and these conferences were organized as part of programme of Subject Associations

The theme of the student led conference organized at Juhu campus on March 17-18, 2016 was, "Smart Education for A Smart Generation". There was participation of about 325 students and faculty. The chief guest for the Conference was Dr. Anil Kakodkar, former chairperson, Atomic energy commission of India. The chief guest for

The student led Seminar held on March 30, 2016 at the Churchgate campus had the theme,"India 2020: Prospects and Challenges". The chief guest for the valedictory function was Honorable retired Chief Justice Shri Hemant Laxman Gokhale. 448 participants attended this conference.

During the year 2015-16 there were 172 colleges affiliated to SNDT Women's University which were spread across 7 States; Maharashtra (151), Gujarat (13), Goa (1), Uttar Pradesh (3), Madhya Pradesh (2), Bihar (1) and Assam (1). (Please see Appendix B for the detailed state wise list of affiliated colleges)

10.4 Academic programmes offered by the University during 2015-16

During the year 2015-16 the University offered 51 Ph.D. programmes, 52 Masters programmes, 45 Bachelors programmes, 24 Post Graduate Diploma programmes, and 15 Diploma programmes. Please refer to Appendix E for the list of programmes offered during the year.

10.6 Ph.D. programme

University gives due importance to this highest degree programme offered. It conducts Ph.D. Entrance Test (PET) twice a year (generally in June and December). Ph.D. registrations are done during the month of January and July.

- 121 candidates appeared for PET in May 2015 and 58 candidates appeared for the same in November 2015
- 27 Scholars registered for Ph.D. Programme in July 2015 and 17 registered in January 2016.



The Examinations Section, under the supervision and guidance of the Board of Examinations, organizes and holds examinations and implements the measures for improving the system of examinations and complies with the recommendations made by the Examinations Reforms committee. The schedule of dates of Examinations and declaration of results are prepared at the beginning of the academic year.

The Examinations Section conducts the examinations for about 55,000 students, studying at 11 Conducted colleges, 43 Post-Graduate Departments and 170 Affiliated Colleges situated in the seven States and one Union Territory of India.

During the year 2015-16 Examinations Section undertook several progressive steps towards the reforms in Examination. The status of implementation of recommendations of Rajesh Aggarwal Committee Report on Examinations reforms during the year 2015-16 is shown hereunder:

1. Effective end-to-end use of ICT for reforms in Examinations

Services under MKCL e-Suvidha are already in place from admission to admit card generation. Question papers delivery for all programmes is outsourced. Post Examination/ Convocation work is carried out at University Computer Centre.

2. Online student registration for examinations to issuance of hall ticket

Services under MKCL e-Suvidha are already in place from admission to admit card generation. A College Facilitation Centre (CFC) has been established for the convenience of students of the University Departments and colleges.

3. Questions Bank/ Question Paper Bank Creation

Number of workshops for paper-setters on creating Question Bank/Question Paper Banks were conducted from time to time and developing in-house software is in process. It will be implemented for the University Examinations to be held in Oct/Nov - 2017.

4. Secure Delivery of Examination Papers

100% e-mode transfer of question papers of all University Examination at all the Examination Centres located in 7 States and in 1 Union Territory.

5. OMR and Barcode Technology in cover page of Answer sheets

OMR and Bar Code Technology has been implemented for all the University Examinations since Oct/Nov/Dec 2015.

6. Digital Scanning and Onscreen evaluation

Pilot project for B. Tech Examinations had during the academic year 2015-16 was successfully carried out.

7. Result Processing and publication

Results of all the examinations are processed at the Computer Centre and displayed on the University website http://sndt.ac.in/exam-section/results.htm

8. Other Technologies for reducing malpractices

The Information Security policy is in place to outline the acceptable use of computer equipment and information assets at SNDTWU. CCTV in Pariksha Bhavan and CAP building, OMR/Bar Code on answer books, plagiarism detection software is used, scanning of answer books, scanning of marks, secure delivery of question papers, dedicated courier service for delivery to and collection from all examination centres, adequate number of examiners and moderators and revaluators appointed to ensure timely declaration of results and to prevent any malpractices.

9. Data Centre Facilities

The University has its own 30 years old Computer Centre and data storage facility including two blade servers and storage procured and installed.

10. Physical Security Measures

Centralised Biometric Systems for all campuses, Closed-circuit Television System (CCTV) installed, Fire Resistant Mobile File Compactors have been installed in Examination Section, Dedicated Examination Building/House (Pariksha Bhavan) – Parikasha Bhavan is already constructed. Extension of ParikshaBhavan is envisaged and the same will be carried out in near future.

11. IT related Capacity Building and Handholding Support

Computer Awareness Training to staff of the University, its Departments and conducted/affiliated Colleges have been conducted, Handholding support such as - appointment of Technical staff / outsourcing of certain processes, training to paper setters in effective use of IT for setting the question papers for University Examinations and development of Question Banks. Training is imparted to the Examiners and Moderators for on-screen evaluation/ moderation of answerbooks of the University examinations.

12. Decentralization of Examination Activities

About 983 University Examinations (502+481) are being conducted in a year at 250 examination centres located in 7 states and 1 Union Territory. It is proposed to conduct onscreen evaluation and moderation of answer-books for all University Examinations to be held in Oct/ Nov/Dec - 2017, at 15 CAP centres located at various colleges in Maharashtra and Gujarat.

13. Increasing CAP Centres

In order to ensure timely assessment / moderation of answer books and to avoid human errors and further to facilitate the result processing onscreen evaluation and moderation of answer-books at more number of CAP centres (15) have been introduced.

14. Ensuring timely declaration of results

Most of the examination results are declared within 30-45 days.

15. Increasing CAP Centres

In order to ensure timely assessment / moderation of answer books and to avoid human errors and further to facilitate the result processing onscreen evaluation and moderation of answer-books at more number of CAP centres (15) have been introduced.



16. Increased Emphasis on Industrial Training, Practical and Application oriented Projects in Evaluation

Internship and Dissertation carrying 8 credits each have been introduced at all Master's Degree Programmes. Whereas Bachelor's Degree programme such as B. Pharm, B.Tech. etc. also have internship.

17. Wholesome Education by Universities through Non-Credit/Certification Courses, Self-certification, Extra Marks/Credits, MOOC etc.

Incentive marks are given to students participating in NSS, NCC, extra-curricular and sport activities.

18. Plagiarism Detection Software

Online portals used for detection of plagiarism in case of Ph.D.

19. Responsibility of imparting IT training to teaching and administrative staff

Number of training programmes on use of ICT are being conducted for staff members of the University, University Departments and Colleges from time to time.

20. Involvement of COE and Director, IT in the decision making

Technology Committee consisting of 6 members from CST, IT, Electronics, Telecommunication, Management background provides necessary inputs for the effective use of ICT in entire process of University Examinations. The Director, BOEE is a permanent invitee of the Management Council, Academic Council and the Senate with the right to speak and participate in deliberations. He is also a member secretary of the BOEE.

21. Strengthening of Examinations Cell/Division at Universities

The sufficient staff including Director BOEE, Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrars (2), Computer Programmer, Assistant Accountant, Head Clerks(4), Senior Clerks, Clerk-cum-Typist, Technical Assistant(3), Data Entry Operators have been posted in the Examination Section.

22. Capacity Building of Faculty for effective handling of ICT based application

Number of training programmes on use of ICT are being conducted for faculty members of the University and its Departments and conducted /affiliated Colleges from time to time.

23. Equipping Examination Cells/Divisions with appropriate Technical Manpower

It is proposed to create the following additional posts in order to strengthen the Examination Cell in general and the Computer Centre in particular: 1-Programmer, 2- Maintenance Engineer, 3 - Technical Assistant, 3 -Data Entry operators.

24. Accessibility of Examination Centres

Examination centre close to the place of residence is allotted to differently able students and necessary instructions are issued to the Principal of the concerned College/Superintendent of Examinations to make suitable arrangements and to grant extra time to such students to complete their examination.



25. Financial Requirements and Modalities of ICT Solutions

Necessary provisions to the tune of Rs 5.50 cores for ICT implementation such as online delivery of question papers at examination centres, printing of answer-books with OMR/BAR Code, scanning of answer-books, on line evaluation, e-Suvidha portal, purchase of hardware and software, creation of Question Banks/question paper banks, dematting of degree certificates, CFC centre etc. have been made in the annual budget of the University Examinations for the year 2017-18.



Student Services

University Library Syatem

The SNDT Women's University Library is a multi-unit library system with a Central Library at the University's main campus at Churchgate, Mumbai, two libraries at the Pune and Juhu campuses and a Children's Library at Juhu.

- SNDT Women's University library has progressed a good deal by providing open access to nearly 4 lakh books & bound volumes,
- acquiring different kind of documents especially e-form, cataloguing & processing them appropriately, storing and giving access to its nearly 8000 patrons not only in library premises, but also from any part of the world.
- The Library OPAC, gives detailed information about library sources including books, journals, E-journals, and databases with different search tools for its users. Other details like working hours, library rules, staff details, contact persons, etc. are provided on the website.
- Users can access more than 30000 full text journals from the aggregators like Ebsco and Proquest, from E-Shodhsindhu consortium of Inflibnet and from publishers directly covering titles published by Elsevier (ScienceDirect), Springer, John Wiley, Emerald, Cambridge, Sage, IEEE etc.
- > Links to various other databases like Manupatra, AIR, Statistical database, EPW are also made available.
- SNDT library uploaded 144 theses on Shodhganga repository, which provides a platform for research students to deposit their Ph.D. theses and made it available to the entire scholarly community in open access.
- The Library provides a number of innovative information services including Journal Contents Service, News Clipping Service, Monthly Documents Additions Lists, Info Alert Service, displays throughout the year and best user of the month.
- In order to keep pace with the Gen Y users, library continue the technology based services like sending brief information via way2sms, e-mail alerts and providing descriptive information on website or facebook.
- Library conducts orientations for all new students (department wise) and information literacy workshops so that the students have easy access to the library resources.
- > The yearly Granthotsav, a festival of books, is organized at all 3 libraries with fun filled knowledge based activities, competitions and book exhibition. Library also organizes lecture series and conference for the library professionals.

Hostels

All the 3 campuses (Churchgate, Juhu and Pune) provide hostel facility. The hostel at Maharshi Karve Vidyavihar, Churchgate has a capacity of 190 seats, at Pune and Juhu campuses the capacity is of 400 seats each. Wifi facility is provided in hostels. Each hostel is looked after by the Hostel Superintendent who is assisted by the Hostel Warden.

Students celebrate many festivals as well as Annual Day. Students also have access to various indoor games. Moreover, they can use the sports ground. Churchgate campus provides Badminton as well as Basket Ball court. Hostel students along with Day-Scholars use these facilities.

Each hostel provides medical facility to the students through a visiting medical officer.

Health Centre

The Annual Medical Checkup was held on 3rd, 4th and 5th of August 2015 at Churchgate campus, on 6th and 7th of August 2015 at Juhu campus and on 10th and 11th of August 2015 at Pune campus. It was organized by the Department of

• Road Safety Promotion: Car Rally (July 8, 2015)

As a part of the campaign promotion of a women's safety application developed by The Top Gear Magazine was done and awareness was created through social media.

30 participants from UMIT and P.V.Polytechnic learned the use of ACTIVE PRESENTER application software on July 17, 2015. Trained students later developed OER to be used for Digital Literacy Program adapted by SNDTWU. The workshop was conducted at Department of Educational Technology. The second batch of 30 participants from UMIT and P.V. Polytechnic learned the use of ACTIVE PRESENTER application software on July 18, 2015 from 10.00 to 1.30pm.The Screen cast Video workshop was also extended to third batch of 25 participants from P. V. Polytechnic who learned the use of ACTIVE PRESENTER application software on July 20, 2015.

• Workshop on Innovative Ideas for Digital India (July 22, 2015)

To develop new idea and to communicate it to the reader, scientific way of writing skill should be developed. Keeping this in mind workshop was planned on July 22, 2015. Prof. Sanjay Shitole (UMIT) conducted a session on "Scientific Way of Writing the Innovative Ideas". Dr. Sanajy Pawar enlightened students about "Upcoming Challenges and Issues in Technology". The workshop helped students to think clearly and communicate innovative ideas about development of new technologies.

Writing innovative ideas contest helped participating students to clear the thoughts about the number of issues our citizens are facing. More than 100 students participated in this contest. They were involved in rigorous discussions at the time of writing innovative ideas. ACM Chapter of UMIT organized a seminar to encourage the students for this contest and 196 students were benefited from this seminar on "Writing Innovative Ideas in a Scientific Way."

Many ideas were related to improvement of farmer's life, improvement of current technologies for disabled people, innovative ways to promote Indian citizens for on-line voting. More than 300 hours were utilized by activity cocoordinator, student council and seven chapters.

• Workshop on Unified Modelling Language (July 22, 2015)

A workshop on Unified Modelling Language (UML) was organized by DI@SNDTWU. It is modelling language and



design methodology of any system using object oriented concepts. The workshop had also covered the topics like Open source UML tool BOUML, StarUML are used for practice. The workshop was made interactive with the help of inputs from participants.

• Webinar on Computer Network and Network Security (July 27, 2015)

The Webinar explained the concept of 'Computer network and Network security', further it explained the threats to a computer network especially when connected to web. The effective use of firewall has been also an important part of webinar. Speaker had addressed the questions asked through live chat and cleared the doubts of users logged in. The webinar included topics like Challenges for Network Operator, NGN Architecture, Security of Information Assets, Legal Drivers and Challenges before the industry, Cyber Security Strategy in India, Status of Security and Quality Compliance in India, PC and end user Security.

• A Workshop on Python Programming (August 1, 2015)

A workshop on Python Programming Language was organized as part of the DI Campaign @SNDTWU. In this initiative more than 400 students were trained for the software technologies such as UML and Python. Student council and seven chapters of UMIT took lot of efforts to promote this activity. More than 600 Human-hours were utilized in this activity and still students are developing applications and coming with new solutions for every field of life.
