

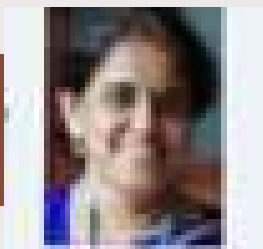

## 1. Learning through Collaboration

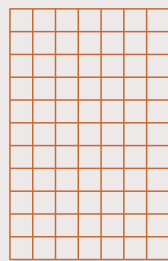
Collaborations are an excellent way to bridge the gap between industry and academia. University Grants Commission (UGC) has also highlighted the importance of collaboration in teaching-learning.

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## 2. Internship Component



## 3. Research Component

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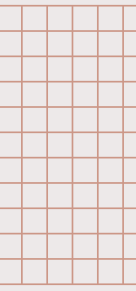


# Outcomes

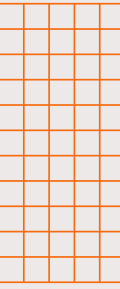

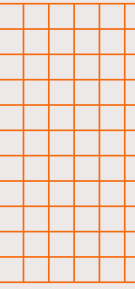
