Foreword

Women's education and S.N.D.T. Women's University go hand in hand. The University having acquired statutory recognition in 1951 with the rare privilege of jurisdiction across the country has over 75,000 students in various liberal and professional courses. In the year 2016, SNDT Women's University completed 100 years of its glorious existence.

University Department of Extension Education came into existence in the year 1982 and since then offers Master, M.Phil. and PhD programmes in Extension Education. The Post Graduate Diploma in Communication and Media was initiated in 1994 and Master in Human Ecology and Community Development as an integrated course offered in 2009. In the year 2015, Department started M.A. programme in Media and Communication.

This is a compilation of research and production activities at the Department carried out over the period of over three decades. It includes print, audio, audio-visual and research outputs undertaken mainly due to the collaboration of students and faculty members over the years. The intention of putting this work together was to bring the work done by the Department in the sunlight. It also reveals the dynamic nature of the discipline of Home Science Extension Education.

Initially the nutrition officers joined the course to enhance their knowledge in extension. Gradually the course became popular even among the local students – we are proud to mention that the first student of the 1982 batch with her background of Nutrition and Extension was employed by UNICEF, who is holding a senior position today.

To diversify, the Department also started another stream of communication and media in the year 1993. The aim of this one year Post Graduate Diploma programme was to train students in the area of Journalism, Advertising and Film Production.

The unique feature of the Post Graduate courses were the field work, work experience in the related agencies and research work as a part of the curriculum. With this training the students got jobs immediately. Apart from academic courses, the Department focused more on action research projects and productions which really helped us to reach out to the community.

I congratulate Mira Desai for compiling the data of Dissertations as well as Research and Productions, right from the year 1984 till the present time. It is really a herculean task which has been completed successfully. I appreciate her enthusiasm and wish her great success in the years to come.

The coastal fisherwomen of Maharashtra performed all post harvest activities after the fish was landed yet they were not recognised as productive workers. Research was, therefore, undertaken to study the participation of women in fisheries in terms of operation, time, period of involvement and technologies being used. The occupational workload of fisherwomen in selected activities was evaluated. Impact of modern technology on the lives of fisherwomen was also assessed.

The study was carried out in two fishing villages – Versova in Greater Bombay district and Satpati in Thane district. Three hundred fisherwomen in the age group of 20-50 years actively involved in fisheries constituted the sample. Data was collected using a semi-structured interview schedule. Energy expenditure and cardiac cost of their work was calculated using an experimental design.

The data collected revealed sex role stereotyping, emphasising gender specific role distribution in the fishing economy. Fish capture and net making remained exclusively a male domain, the role of women confine to post harvest activities from fish processing to marketing. They were involved in sorting, washing, icing, scaling & gutting, salting, drying and marketing of fish. The activities were seasonal in nature.

They spent more time in fisheries tasks (7.50 hours) as compared to household chores (6.25 hours). As regards to

adoption of modern technology, women had access to only cold storage. The physiological cost of selected activities was moderately heavy, being the highest in washing activity and the minimum in sorting.

Instincts of helpfulness and compassion are instrumental in welfare activities. The concept of welfare is comprehensive and relative in terms of time and space. As an extension worker and a teacher, the investigator came in contact with voluntary agencies. A need was felt to study the agencies systematically and scientifically so that suitable changes could be made in the home-science curriculum. Present study was taken to know the objectives of selected voluntary agencies as perceived by them, enlist activities taken up by voluntary agencies, understand organizational structure and administrative procedure followed, study the satisfaction of the beneficiaries, find out measures taken to improve working of the agencies and identify difficulties faced by the agencies. Methodology included selection of 26 agencies and 274 beneficiaries through incidental and purposive sampling. Two tools- questionnaire cum check-list and satisfaction scale were used. Major findings of the study were- most of the agencies lacked the ideological base for their work. Their objectives were specific but not well defined. They took up a wide variety of activities. The agencies that are started in the last 30 years did not take up many cultural and religous activities. It is observed that there was no uniformity or standardization in the organizational set-up. There are different committees in all the agencies. The staffing pattern showed that secretarial and Class IV employees were employed in all the agencies but technical and professional staff was employed in 57.6% and 69.0% respectively. The staffing pattern was haphazard and inadequate and the staff were underpaid. Majority of the agencies depended on donations for finances. They did not prefer the Government aid as it was insufficient and time consuming to obtain. Questions about expenditure pattern met with luke warm response. Most of the agencies did not possess assets. Their financial practices need improvement. Their score on management practices was not high. They increased the number of activities and catered to more beneficiaries over a period of time. They faced problems of getting friends, space, dedicated volunteers and workers. A profile of the beneficiaries suggested that majority of them were young (< 35), literate up to Xth standard, had income of < Rs. 1000.00 per month, were married and had working experience of < 7 years. The score on satisfaction scale showed that half of the beneficiaries obtained the score between 22-28 and the remaining got < 22 (Maximum obtainable score for the satisfaction scale was 28). Spirit of volunteerism and professional approach are the need of the day. Income generating activities; aggressive marketing strategies; some job reservation for needy women and facilities such as day care centres need to be made available more easily. Welfare or developmental work is needed. Spirit of volunteerism is vanishing and dedicated workers are not many. There are a few who are qualified and possess the necessary attitude and they manage to find funds. When funds are visible more people jump into this business of running voluntary agencies. By combining all the efforts and integrating them properly, synergic effects can be attained. The total development benefits are likely to be much more than the sum of benefits of individual inputs.

Nutrition education has been recognised as a potent tool for prevention and control of malnutrition all over the world. The present study aimed at developing nutrition communication package targeted towards initiating change in nutrition behaviour with a specific focus on PEM and Vitamin A deficiency. The package was executed and its effectiveness was tested in the community. The study was undertaken in two selected slum areas of Mumbai, of which one area served as experimental group and the other one as control group. The study population included 320 mothers of pre-school age children and 10 Community Health Workers who were working in the experimental area. The study was carried out in four phases, viz. Situational analysis, Development of action plan for nutrition communication, Execution of nutrition communication actions and Evaluation. Action plan for nutrition communication, consisting of development of modules for mothers and lesson plan for training Community Health Workers was formulated. Training and capacity building of Community Health Workers was undertaken to enable them to be effective facilitators. Community health workers and mothers participated in the process of development of modules. Participatory learning approach using innovative communication methods and group dynamics were used for effective communication of modules. The modules were executed and evaluated in the experimental group for their effectiveness. Integrated food-based activities were also carried out for the children. Assessment of knowledge, skills and overall performance of CHWs showed that all the field workers were able to use appropriate communication skills and to address nutritional problems in the community and give practical quidance in difficulties expressed by mothers. The communication methods used to convey messages were seen to be effective. The findings of the regular module sessions revealed that all the modules were well accepted and understood by the mothers. The findings of the KAP of the mothers revealed that in the experimental group, mothers were better aware of nature of under nutrition and food-based actions to prevent and control the same. Change in knowledge about foods and preparations was also reflected in their attitudes and actual practices in the experimental group as compared to the control group. Significant change in intake of energy and protein while no significant change was observed in vitamin A intake and also the nutritional status of the children after the intervention period. "Training Modules for Trainers" to train health workers were evolved as an outcome of the study. Nutrition communication modules, which were tested with the mothers were compiled for practical use for others in community. During the process of intervention, volunteers from the mothers' group were identified and mobilised who would act as "change agents" to initiate and support change in nutrition behaviour of people in the community.

The present study was undertaken with the intention to find out the knowledge gain, adoption of advanced technologies and improvement in the skills of farmwomen after attending the trainings of Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Kota. Perception of farmwomen regarding the trainings and its effectiveness, their perceived needs and attitude towards advanced technologies of agriculture and decision making pattern in the families of farm- women were also studied. Sample of the study were selected considering the number of farm- women trained by the centre during the years 1996- 99 and attended at least three trainings organized by the centre. The structured interview schedule was used to know the impact of the trainings on the farm- women who attended the trainings of KVK, Kota. Frequencies, percentage, mean, standard deviation, coefficient of correlation, stepwise regression analysis and path analysis were carried out to know the important variables and their predictive ability in explaining the variation to the dependent variable. Majority of illiterate, married, land less farm- women ranging in the age group of 15 to 25, living in joint family and having a medium size family attended the trainings of KVK. The most frequent used methods were lectures, demonstrations and fieldtrips. The need of advanced technologies in milking of animals, hygiene precautions after calving, development of fish-pond, food preservation, grain storage, water purification, care & maintenance of tractor and weedicides were perceived by the farm- women. As far as decision making pattern of the family was concerned, the eldest male member of the family was taking the decision. Decision by the self was observed only in the area of food preparation and fruits & vegetables preservation. Regarding the impact of the training medium gain in the knowledge, adoption of advanced technologies and improvement in skills of farm- women were found out. Significant correlation with the knowledge was found with age, educational level, past experience of training and exposure to media. Positive correlation was found with marital status, family size, contact with experts and perceived needs of advanced technologies with the knowledge of farm- women For adoption of advanced technologies significant positive correlation was found only with age. Positive correlation was found with age, marital status, exposure to media and contacts wath experts with improvement in the skills. Exposure to media exerted largest and positive direct effect followed by perceived needs for advanced technologies, and their type of family on the knowledge of the farm- women. The highest direct positive effect on the adoption of advanced technologies was influenced by exposure to media followed by contacts with experts, age and family size of farmwomen. The highest direct positive influence on the improvement in the skills of farmwomen was exerted by exposure to media. So far as the Stepwise regression analysis were concerned knowledge of the farm- women were influenced by mainly exposure to media and attendance in the acti\ities of the centre. Contribution of the variance in dependent variable adoption of advanced technologies was made by four significant variables mainly attendance in the activities of the centre, exposure to media, land holdings and perceived needs for advanced technologies. Contribution in the dependent variable improvement in the skills of farm- women was made by five variables namely attendance in the activities of the centre, exposure to media, past experience of training, land holdings and age.

Dr. Rajni Asher

Dr. Ranjan Parekh



Dr. Ranjan Parekh joined the SNDT Women's University in the year 1962. Initially she taught Social Sciences at the undergraduate level and then as a Head of the Department. She introduced specialization in the Home Science Extension from the year 1978, as no other colleges of Home Science had this specialization in the State of Maharashtra. With the success of this programme, the Post Graduate Dept. of Extension was established in the year 1982. Later the courses at M. Phil and Ph.D. levels were started to meet the demand of students.
