The workshop on **Story-telling** focuses on encouraging the listeners' imagination and expand horizons in various fields. **A.C.T.I.V.E Early Childhood Environment** focuses on merging traditional ideas and practices with current research facilitating the development of children. **Rubrics** is an authentic assessment tool used to measure students' work emphasizing on particular details as a model for students. **Technology in Early Childhood Education** which helps in strengthening visual attention, better eye-hand co-ordination and developing skills and talents. **Technology in Preschool Arena** will provide insight into effective preschool learning through software and applications. **Whole Language Approach** discusses reading by recognizing words as whole pieces of language benefitting children in reading, writing and learning. **Learning through games** will help increase the child's attention, language and math skills and problem solving abilities. **Music and Movement** engages and stimulates the brain enhancing higher forms of intelligence and abstract thinking of the child. **Dramatization** which builds confidence, increases concentration and develops language and communication skills of the child. The next session on **Montessori Method** is based on self directed activities and facilitates the learning of children by helping them explore through their senses. **Theme based Curriculum Planning** is a vehicle for teaching a range of skills and content building a foundation for literacy, numeracy, critical thinking and promotes a positive attitude.

The valedictory function will be held on 17<sup>th</sup> September 17, 2016 at 4 pm in J. H. Mini Auditorium on Juhu campus. Ms Swarup Sampat, actor, trainer and educationist will be the chief guest of the function.
